

How to Host a "Cancelled Check" Campaign Party Diverting Hard Cash from Pro-War Candidates

Thank you for hosting a Cancelled Check party! The purpose of a Cancelled Check event is to divert votes and dollars from pro-war candidates to send a message to candidates and incumbents that peace voters will not be taken for granted.

<u>Here's what to do:</u> Invite friends, colleagues, and fellow activists to your home or community space. Each attendee writes a brief note to the pro-war candidate(s) or incumbent(s) in your district explaining that they are losing his/her vote <u>and</u> hard cash donation due to their position on the Iraq war. The attendee writes a check to the pro-war candidate or incumbent with VOID written clearly over the check. Then he/she writes a second check for the same amount to his/her favorite peace cause. (We've included a list of peace groups which are part of the VotersForPeace project for your reference.)

Parties can be as small as 3 people or as big as several hundred people. Perhaps you can provide coffee and tea, or wine and snacks. Also consider doubling this party as a film showing of "Why We Fight" or "Iraq For Sale", two great films that talk about the power and might of the military-industrial complex. You can also use this tactic during your pledge-gathering tabling efforts at community events.

Things to organize beforehand:

- 1. Provide large envelopes to send the candidate letters/checks, small envelopes for peace donations, and some postage. Also be sure to have plenty of pens and writing paper.
- 2. Have a list on-hand of <u>all</u> candidates for Congress and Senate with their mailing addresses. You can go to the FEC website (http://www.fec.gov/finance/disclosure/srssea.shtml) and download the complete list. Ideally you've done research on candidates' positions on withdrawal from Iraq and a US war of aggression against Iran.
- 3. Print out the following materials from our website. If you sign up to host a party, we will also send these materials to you via post:
 - a) VotersForPeace Pledge form to use as a sign-in sheet
 - b) List of peace organizations for possible donations
 - c) Sample letter to pro-war candidate and 'cancelled check'
 - d) Sample letter to local paper
 - e) Sample invitation to your guests

Remember: The most important thing your guests should bring is their checkbook!

Important things to do after the event:

As the host, the best way to make sure the letters and checks get mailed is for you to collect them. This requires just a few steps from you...

- 1. Make copies of the 'peace donation' checks.
- 2. Put the letters, voided checks and copies of the peace donation checks together in one big envelope to the pro-war candidate. Either mail or hand deliver the packets to their local office.
- 3. Mail peace donation checks to the appropriate organizations.
- 4. Fill out our Evaluation Form so we can keep track of pro-war cash diverted to pro-peace efforts!
- 5. Publicize your success. Your local media may find the idea of diverting dollars from pro-war candidates interesting. If your event diverts \$50, \$500 or \$5,000 from a pro-war candidate, send a letter to your local news outlets. Be sure to tell them who received the voided checks and how much money was diverted. Include photos of the event!
- 6. Follow up with a thank you to the party attendees. Better yet, ask them to host their own cancelled check party!
